



As we've had some days of lovely weather, we are noticing more students staying after school to enjoy the field and playaround. We love seeing our community out enjoying the sunshine and each other's company! We want to clarify the expectations for after school to ensure everyone makes it safely home and in a timely manner.

At the time of dismissal, all students need to immediately start their journey home.

•Those riding the bus should head straight to the bus loop.

•Students being picked up out front should head that direction to catch their ride.

•Students walking home should start moving towards the appropriate exit gate.

Teachers are outside their doors to help get everyone moving in the right direction. When teachers see students that haven't been picked up, they will bring them to the office where we will call home to check in.

Families that are out back waiting to pick up their child(ren) are welcome to play outside as we can account that the student has connected with their family. It is not permissible for students to remain playing outside without their parent/guardian present. We do not have after school supervision or programming to monitor behavior outside or ensure students are heading home in the right direction once teachers have done a final sweep.

Please remember the only adults who have permission to take your child from school are those you have listed on the **registration card**. This should match the information you can see in Focus. If you have questions about this or need to make some changes, please contact the front office. You will need to make these changes in person.


HOW TO HELP CHILDREN DEAL WITH CONFLICT

It's hard to resolve conflict when you are angry. Here are a few steps to help your child return to calm and resolve whatever is bothering them.

- 1. Redirect with soothing activities like time with a pet, or deep breathing.
- 2. Invite your child to pitch solutions to the problem that feel the best and discuss.
- 3. Help your child understand how to express feeling in a way others will understand. "I feel" statements are useful. Role playing resolution options can also be effective.
