**Announcement from GSD**, by Julie Jackson

- Encouraged attendance at the District Community Council Meetings
  - Workshop based, with a focus on gathering and collaborating input from community voices regarding a district vision of what a High School Graduate should look like and how that translate to goals for different stages of education

**Boundary Study**, presented by Steve Hogan and Ben Horsley

- Informal presentation to share information and answer any questions
- Current boundary studies for GSD include:
  - Van Winkle/700 East Corridor Study (requested by local area schools and communities to address their low student populations)
  - East-side Study of Cottonwood/OlyImpus/Skyline boundaries
    - With an end goal of creating three strong high school communities
- Anticipated schedule and milestones for boundary studies
  - 2 years ago GSD commissioned a population study of the entire GSD
    - Current Student Population is approximately 59,000
    - Anticipated future student population 55,000 - 57,000
    - Historically high for student population was 76,000
  - Currently, the GSD is presenting information to affected communities, answering questions and taking feedback in scheduled meetings at various locations during the upcoming month

- The GSD committee reviewing the boundary study have a 15-point-criteria list that they look at when considering boundary changes and/or school closures
  - 20-member committee from GSD will present initial findings to GSD School Board in June or July
    - The School Board will then either give a recommendation to continue, pause, or end study
  - If Boundary Study continues, options and plans will be formulated during the summer and then formal recommendations are presented to affected communities in the Fall of 2022 for feedback
- Rosecrest is not currently on any list for closure
  - If any boundary changes involve Rosecrest, the community will be notified
  - Most likely scenario would be to add to the boundary to increase the school's population
- GSD sees an ideal elementary school, as one that has three classes for each grade; thus having enough of a student population to maximize the funds and programs available

**DDC Updates**, presented by Principal Ambrose

- Council continues to work on a portrait of a graduate
- New College, Career & Life Readiness (CCLR) standards were presented, these will appear on the 2022-2023 report card
  - Changes will be shared community wide at the start of school
  - PBIS team will work on merging CCLR standards with Rosecrest PBIS
