#### Principal's Message:

Dear Patrons,

We are off and running with another great school year. I wanted to share with you several improvements to our grounds and building that took place over the summer. Many of you are aware of the installation of the new turf field in the football stadium. It is a beautiful addition to our grounds and will increase usage of the stadium. It was a race to get it done on time. At the time of the ribbon cutting, the last sod was being laid signaling the end of the project.

Other noteworthy projects that were completed over the summer, or are nearing completion at this time, include the pre-school playground which is located directly west of "A" Building which will serve students learning about child care and considering a career in that area. There was a new sound system installed in the auditorium. It is working very well and it is now possible to hear performers and speakers regardless of the location of your seat in the auditorium. It will be a treat to have this new system and enjoy our theatre students' performance of "Fiddler on The Roof" this fall. District employees and directors have worked with me to help provide funding for new starting blocks in the pool building. This is much needed and we are looking to have the blocks installed soon. The Skyline stadium will also be receiving a new scoreboard due to collaborative efforts between the school and the community. Finally, the drama classroom has been upgraded with a small sound and lighting

system to create a black box theatre where smaller plays can be performed.

All in all, much has been improved at Skyline over the summer. It is exciting to watch the different groups begin to utilize these new facilities.

Just recently, you may also have heard that Skyline received an "A" grade for its school grade this year. This is an increase over the "B" that we received last year. Congratulations to all who worked hard to make this happen including our students, teachers, parents, administration, and all staff members. Skyline students increased their scores in almost every category. Secondary Math II students and faculty should be particularly proud because of the 21% point improvement they made in their scores. Skyline English Language Arts scores are highest in the state among public high schools.

Skyline students have access to tutoring services and paraprofessional trackers who provide additional help and support for students to increase their learning opportunities. Classes were also added to help reduce class sizes. These services are provided through the efforts of the Community Council's approval of Skyline's Land Trust Plan and appropriation of funds supporting these areas. Thanks to all who work so diligently to make Skyline a great place to learn, work, and succeed.

PSAT is a test for Juniors; however, Sophomores may also take this test as a practice test, but need to take the PSAT again as a Junior to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship. This is the practice test for the SAT, and also qualifies Juniors for the National Merit Scholarship. There are 325 tests available; they are sold on a first come, first serve basis. Cost \$ 15.00. ## Skyline Media Center

### **Things to Know about the Library:**

- Library hours are 7-3:30 each day.
- You can check out books for two weeks with your student ID card. If you need/want more time to read a particular book, you can renew it.
- You can request a book for purchase by clicking on the Media Center tab on the Skyline school website.
- We have mounted iPads in the Media Center for you to use while you are here. You can find a book, play a game, explore the apps, do research, whatever.
- You can access Destiny (our library software) from your own student account on the computers. With Destiny you can look up your fees from the library, browse the library catalogue, and place a hold on a book.
- We have puzzles, chess, and checkerboards for students to enjoy before or after school or during lunch.
- **FOOD AND DRINKS** (including water) **ARE NOT ALLOWED** in the library. But we do have an outdoor courtyard that you can use for eating – just ask a staff member to unlock the door for you.
- We love to have students spending time in the library, but we do ask that you clean up after yourselves – Please throw away any trash and push in your chairs before you leave.
- Check out what your teachers are reading by seeing what they have posted on their reading tiles.

## Reading to Go . . .



Did you know that you can checkout iPads in the Skyline library? There are 25 iPads available for checkout to students for two weeks at a time. All you need is an approval form filled out by you and your parents. You can get one from any library staff member.

Does your student hate to carry a book, or pay late library fees? Check out books using the OverDrive app, and solve this problem. Students already have an account. Follow these directions to get started:



1. Download OverDrive App. (This app is available through iTunes, Google and Android stores, and other eReader devices.) Great thing this app is free!
2. Create an OverDrive account. This allows books to be visible on multiple devices.
3. Click menu.
4. Add a library
5. Search for your school and click on it.
6. Click the star and then "Granite District".
7. User Name and Passwords are student computer login.
8. Download ebooks or audio books for reading or listening in the OverDrive app.
9. Enjoy up to three books at a time.



Books will automatically return on due date, with no late fees. Anyone who checks out a book on OverDrive gets entered into a monthly drawing for prizes.

## Career Center

College and Career Ready means that you are ready to apply to college and you are ready to take college-level courses. It also means that through career experiences (classes, internship, volunteering, seminars, etc.) you

have some skills and are ready to make college major choices.

We just finished with College Day (September 18), but we have many other events scheduled this fall to help students in their pursuit of College and Career Readiness.

- Out-of-State college visits: September-October. Please visit the Career Center website for more details.
- ASVAB Test (for juniors) and PLAN Test (for Sophomores) were administered on September 18<sup>th</sup>. Scores will be distributed in November for the PLAN test and January for the ASVAB test.
- College Application Week: November 9-14, helping students overcome application barriers and helping students apply for college

Right now is an important time for Senior students to apply for scholarships. We have several popular scholarships posted on the Skyline Career Center website. You may also visit [www.UtahFutures.org](http://www.UtahFutures.org) or [www.bigfutures.collegeboard.org](http://www.bigfutures.collegeboard.org). Both of these websites offer a comprehensive scholarship search which gives you access to thousands of scholarships. We recommend that Senior students apply for at least two scholarships each month during their senior year of school. Last year our students earned over \$12 million dollars in scholarships. If you do not fill out the application then your portion of the \$12 million will be zero.

Your last opportunity to take the ACT and submit your scores before the Priority Application Deadline (December 1) at BYU, SUU, or U of U is October 24. To sign up to take the ACT you must go to [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org). If you have not yet signed up for the October 24 test date you may still do so as a "Standby" examinee. **All junior students will take the ACT here at Skyline for free during the school day in March.**

To help students prepare for the ACT, USOE is paying for the use of an ACT preparation website: [www.shmoop.com/utah](http://www.shmoop.com/utah). To gain access to this website you must go to the website, find the Skyline signup page, create a username and password, then enter the "Magic" word (ARCHES)

## A Summary of Skyline Math Contests

- **AIME:** The American Invitational Mathematics Examination is a three-hour test consisting of fifteen questions. Only students who perform exceptionally well on the AMC are invited to compete. The AIME is the second level of determining the United States Math Team.
- **AMC:** The American Mathematics Competition is the first in a series of contests that are meant to determine the six-member United States Math Team who will compete in the International Mathematical Olympiad. There are three levels of the AMC and those who are in the top 2.5 - 5 percent on the AMC 8, 10 or 12, respectively, are invited to perform in the AIME.
- **ARML:** The American Regions Mathematics League is held once a year nationally. High school students in teams of fifteen represent their city, state, county, or school to compete against other teams from the United States and Canada. The events include the Team, Power, Individual, and Relay rounds. ARML is held simultaneously at Penn State, University of Iowa, San Jose State University, and the University of Georgia.
- **Math Madness:** This is a computer based competition created by the same people as the AMC series. Students log in at a specific time every week and the contest sets our school up against other schools in single elimination brackets similar to march madness. The team score is the average of our top five scoring students. Individuals on each team are also paired off to compete against each other based on past scores. This allows students to not only compete against themselves but also another student of similar ability level. Math Madness starts at the end of September and goes through December.
- **National Assessment and Testing:** This association is in charge of several national math competitions that members of the Math Team compete in. They include the fall startup event, the team scramble, ciphering time trials, and four-by-four competition. There are both individual and collaborative competitions and each has different scoring methods and rules. The events are spread throughout the school year beginning the fourth Thursday in September.
- **SMC:** Utah's State Math Contest is held every March at a Utah university, where students from all throughout Utah compete on an individual basis. The contest is made up of forty multiple-choice problems, and the top six scorers from each grade receive a cash award and recognition at an awards banquet. (BYU will be hosting 2014-2017.)

- **USAMO:** The United States of America Mathematical Olympiad is held annually for only about five hundred invitees. The contest spans two days for a total of nine hours to fully answer six exceedingly difficult math problems. It is the final round of the AMC contest series; the top scorers on the USAMO go on to represent the United States at the International Mathematical Olympiad.

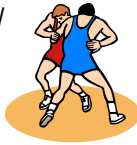

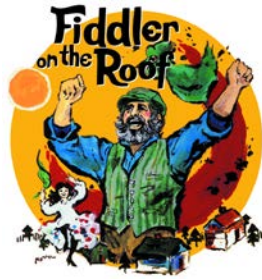
