She has many talents in addition to the languages she teaches, she also has degrees in English Literary Studies and Fashion Design. Here is a comment from the community:

"This year has been a very hard year for my student. He is a transfer student and new to Skyline this year. Because of the pandemic combined with a new school he has often felt lonely and unseen. To top it off, he recently had (an illness) followed by Covid. He has had lingering effects from both and focusing on school has been very challenging. Ms. Carlisle has been very compassionate and understanding and very accommodating to his situation. She has helped him find ways to pass the last couple of terms and has really made him feel validated in his

situation where it would have been very easy to brush him aside. Her online learning has been easy to access and she has been quick to respond and very cheerfully help us find a solution. She has made him feel important and has genuinely tried to help him grow through these challenges. He may not be the world's greatest signer because of his situation, but he has gained a deeper understanding of Deaf culture which has broadened his empathy for many real-life situations, not just in the Deaf culture. But truly the most valuable thing he has learned, or more importantly felt from her, is that he is important, and someone is looking out for him. That is a rare talent and gift in a teacher, especially in this time when so much is demanded of them.”
