Of course, instruction matters, but social context matters too. “Schools need additional resources to successfully educate all students, and these resources, both human and material, are housed in students’ communities” (Shore, 1994). Schools must work to partner with the community and the parents of their students if they wish to maximize the success of their students. The school, especially the teachers, must work, while at school, as though all learning is a result of their work. However, they also must recognize the impact families have.

Harnessing the family and involving them in the efforts to improve the school will speed up and sustain high levels of learning. Researchers have claimed that if teachers help parents to understand the school, understand the goals and action steps toward continuous improvement, as well as their potential role in the process, parents can assist in perpetuating the norm of academic excellence.
