School Recognition and Awards

Men's and Women's Athletics

Skyline High School offers 22 sports for young men and women. We rank among the top sports in Utah across the board in 5A. Since 1990 Skyline has won 66 Championships, a high for our Region and School District. Over 400 men and 400 women participate in a UHSAA sport at Skyline High School.

Debate

Skyline Forensics is a nationally ranked program and has achieved unparalleled records in individual speech events. Each year a record number of Skyline debaters are named region and state champions. Skyline boasts several students recognized as National Forensics League Academic All-Americans.

Off-Campus options/GTI

Skyline partners with the Granite Technical Institute (GTI) to offer a wide variety of Career Technical programs. (<http://schools.graniteschools.org/gti/>). This year, the GTI offers 101 Career and Technical Education courses associated with 14 different fields of study. Examples of these courses are: Medical Assisting, Dental Assisting, Plumbing, Marketing, Computer Programming, Aerospace Manufacturing, Agricultural Science, Engineering Principles, Pilot Ground School, etc. Buses are available at Skyline to transport students to and from the GTI. During the 2022-2023 school year, 269 Skyline students enrolled in one or more classes at the GTI.

CTSO's

Skyline sponsors each of the following Career & Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs): DECA, FBLA, FCCLA, HOSA, Skills USA, TSA. These organizations are established with the commitment to make a positive difference in the lives of our students. In addition to offering a wide variety of specific career and technical training, CTOSs integrate student leadership elements, which compliment student participation in Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses and programs.

Instrumental Music

The Skyline Instrumental Music Department continues to be one of the premier music departments in the state of Utah. The Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, and Orchestra consistently receive superior ratings at region, state, and national festivals. Highlights of the year include concerts, Skyline Concerto Night, a musical theater, and tours.

Vocal Music

Skyline's Choral groups have consistently earned a reputation of excellence, achieving the highest awards in regional, state, and national festivals. Skyline has four advanced performing vocal ensembles which draw many students to the school. The premier ensemble choirs are Madrigals, Concert Choir, Highlites, and Troubadours.

Extracurricular Activities

Skyline has a rich tradition in athletics with 20 varsity sports available to students. Skyline athletic teams have captured many state championships. We have highly competitive and award-winning dance program. Students actively participate in many clubs and organizations representing a wide variety of interests. Student government is an active and vital part of Skyline High School. The Horizon, Skyline's newspaper, earned The Salt Lake Tribune's Fitzpatrick Award. New or Unique Programs

International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

IB is a rigorous, interdisciplinary, international college-preparatory program. The mission statement of IB is "to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help to create a better and more peaceful world through inter-cultural understanding and respect." Skyline has been an IB World School since 2004. Students can begin a rigorous course of study in 9th and 10th grade to prepare them for IB courses in six subject areas their junior and senior years (as well as additional Diploma requirements). Skyline currently offers the following IB course options:

Standard Level (1 Year of College-Level Study)

Spanish, French, Chinese, Math Applications, Math Analysis, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Science, History, Psychology, Economics, Art History, Dance, Music, Theatre, Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay.

Higher Level (2 Years of College-Level Study)

English, Spanish, French, Chinese, Math Analysis, Biology, History, Psychology, Dance, Music, Theatre.

In the 2022-2023 school year, 83 International Baccalaureate students took 518 exams. The Diploma pass rate was 85%.

Community Of Caring

The Community of Caring program provides service-learning experiences for Skyline students while developing positive character and leadership skills. Students will have many opportunities to serve their peers at Skyline as well as serve their neighborhood and community.

Comprehensive Guidance

The Comprehensive Guidance Counseling program is school-wide and promotes student academic achievement, career and educational decision making, and personal and social development. Comp Guidance is a proactive program that addresses the needs, goals, and concerns of all our students.

Concurrent Enrollment

Concurrent Enrollment classes are college-level classes offered to high school students for both high school and college credit. Skyline and GTI has a comprehensive concurrent program offered through Salt Lake Community College, Southern Utah University, Utah Valley University, and Weber State University. Concurrent offerings include classes in art, business, computer technology, physics, cabinetry, digital-media, and exercise science.
