

## Community Council Minutes March

3/10/22

**Attendees:** Jared Broderick, Ellis Rygg, Ashley George, Steffany Austin, Lacey Graham, Stacey Lowe

**Review of Minutes:** Steffany reviewed meeting notes from February. Steffany moved to approve the minutes. Ashley Seconded.

### **Traffic Review:**

Stacey talked about safety problems with drop off. She proposed backing into a spot along the U. She provided a graphic. Increase of 170% of cars being able to park. Discussed cost of painting lines. Mr. Broderick expressed a concern over getting the lines painted quickly. Stacey volunteered to watch the area. Ellis asked about concerns over backing out while some parents might jump ahead. Ashley suggested putting cones out between lanes. Steffany was concerned about who would put the ones out. Ashley reviewed the Eisenhower method of drop off. Lacey talked about her previous school and the plan they used. Questions came up about the morning drop off. Ashley suggested the change for next year, reviewed at back-to-school night. Mr. Broderick suggested sending a survey and invite parents to community council meeting to discuss options.

### **Tentative Staffing Plan:**

Projected 262 students not counting special education teachers. We get 9.5 teachers. We have 1 resource teacher and 3 self-contained teachers. We also get .5 for all day kindergarten. We also get a literacy coach. The current year has 2 teachers in kindergarten, which is 3 sessions (One full day and 2 half days). We would have 1.5 teachers for all grades except 5<sup>th</sup> which will have 2. The teachers decided to keep the plan the same for next year. We will have 2 interns.

### **LandTrust Plan:**

Mr. Broderick updated us on spending. With everything we have 9747 left which will take us until April. Whatever we still need can be put on TTSA. We will use all of our funds, so we won't need an amendment.

For next year, the teachers expressed interest in aides, substitutes for professional development, books for the library, and teacher stipend for back to school. Some alternate ideas are an 0.5 FTE. Steffany expressed importance of above-mentioned teacher interests. Parents asked about summer school numbers vs after school numbers. Mr. Broderick shared after school is more effective by the data. Parents suggested putting funds into after school. Mr. Broderick said he would type the plan and sent to everyone for review.
