Principal's Report (10 mins):

Penny Wars is over as of today and raised \$7555.42, about \$400 more than last year. The school received \$1900 just today! How is Penny Wars money spent: Field Trips and Student Activities, for example:

- 2 field trips for every grade
- As well as the 6th grade U of U field trip
- And the 5th grade Biz Town Activity

The council loves the idea and supports doing something like that. The council recommended having the activity a week after Spring Break ends and April 11th was chosen. The format, 8:30am, parents and kids morning munchie and then students dismissed, and parents given a 20 minute presentation on RISE by Jen.

RISE training for students starts March 20 and will run up until the testing begins 3rd week of April. Will be doing the RISE bingo cards again!

Action Items:

1. Child Access Routing Plan/Safe Walking Route due to District Traffic Safety Committee by March 15, 2023 –

- Already approved earlier in the year. Nothing to do right now.
- 2. Discuss Staffing Plan for 2023-2024 school year: Due March 8, 2023
 - A teacher will be retiring at the end of year Mrs. Gaetz 🙁
 - We will need a 2nd Grade Teacher next year.
 - Will most like get a teacher from the district where there are other schools in the district that are closing at the end of this year.
 - Legislature just approved full-day Kindergarten and we will plan on two next year with one half-day option.



- Two teachers per Grade Level
- Other Estimates
 - 6th grade smallest, 3rd grade highest (approx. 32 per class)
 - Approx. 50 students in kindergarten

3. 2022-2023 LAND Trust Progress Report:

- 1. Purchase of Sound Systems
 - Quotes for the new Sound System 1) \$1500 ea., 2) \$2500 ea.
 - Ed Tech informed the school that they can't use the less costly one due to security and longevity concerns.
 - Moving forward with 4 rooms (our unused \$10,000 from this year)
 - Council is good with that expenditure.

4. LAND Trust Plan for next year (2023-2024):

- 1. Due March 25th

Land TRUST Allocation for 2024 - ~\$54800

We had planned to focus on the MLL students at the school, however, Jen is does not feel good about focusing on only one group but would rather have school-wide goals for teachers, students, and the community to rally around.

Proposed Goals for 2024

- Increase school-wide proficiency by 3% as measured by Math and ELA RISE in 2024
- Increase the percentage of K-2 students at benchmark in literacy by 3%, or to at least 68%, as measured by the Acadience Testing in 2024.
- For MLL students we have a goal to see the difference between non-MLL and MLL students to be reduced by 3% (from 10% to 7% difference) in 2024.
- For SPED students we have a goal to increase proficiency by 3% in 2024.

Land TRUST encumbered actions:

• Hire para's under the supervision of a teacher, to support small groups, interventions, extensions, MLL support, students with disabilities, progress monitoring and PLC time.
