1. Present : Angie Marchant, Andrea Arcos, Christine Christensen, Kristine Davies, Candice Cronin
2. Candice Cronin called the meeting to order
3. Panorama Data
 - a. Reviewed panorama BOY data.
 - b. Highlights – 90% report a supportive relationship
 - c. Target for growth – self-efficacy. Self-management. Challenging Feelings. Also, safety and belonging.
 - d. Many students report that math is hard – we will target that. Math self-efficacy problem uniquely.
 - e. MOY Data coming soon!
4. Safe-walking Route
 - a. Safe routes are in – can check online

5. Social media and cellphones in classrooms – email from Governor Cox.
 - a. Granite is considering a district wide policy about cell phone use. Right now, it is decided at the school level.
 - b. Wilson does not allow use of electronic devices at school but does allow kids to bring phones, watches, and devices to school if they are stored during the day.
 - c. Some instances of cyberbullying in upper grades – photos being taken of kids at school
 - i. Also, problems on Tik Tok, social media, that influence school because kids get upset.
 - d. Discussion:
 - i. No major problems with the cell phone policy right now.
 - ii. What if there is a lockdown and the kid's phone is in the locker? And they can't reach parents? Helpful to have phone for students with anxiety.
 - iii. What about watches? Not major problems, but same policies apply. Some kids have and call home with it.
 - iv. We do have consequences and phones get confiscated if they are misused.
 - v. Consequences for online behavior at home that spills over into school, so we do discipline for that.
 - e. Actions
 - i. Keep our current policy – cell phones allowed before and after school but must be away during the school day.
 - ii. Continue to educate community about the harms of social media and dangers of unrestricted electronic use.
 - iii. Draft an email from Community Council to the Wilson Community.
