To help keep things moving in a positive direction, here are a few things to consider:

Crosswalks

Always use the crosswalks. We have two crosswalks with crossing guards available in the parking lot. Please do not cut across the parking lot with your child. Use the crosswalks and model the importance of listening to the directions being given by the crossing guard.

Parking/Congestion

Curbside is for drop-off/pick-up only, so we request that you park in designated parking stalls if you will be leaving your vehicle.

When dropping-off/picking-up, ask students to get in or out of your vehicle using the door closest to the curb (to avoid having children walking around vehicles).

If you are waiting by the curb and space in front of you opens up, please carefully move forward to help us with congestion.

Ways You Can Help

Be patient and alert.

Consider having your child walk or bike to school.

Consider carpooling.

Thank the crossing guards.
