## b. Information from USBE

Information and Updates from USBE:

### WHAT DOES THE LAW SAY?

53G-7-1202 requires either:

- High schools have a **SCC** with 10 members (6 parents and 4 school employees, including principal), and elementary and secondary schools have a **SCC** with 6 members (4 parents and 2 school employees, including principal), OR
  - A **SCC** determines the size of the school community council by a majority vote or a quorum of the **SCC** provided that there is a 2 parent majority and there are at least 2 school employee members on the council.
- Council seating must be clearly stated (along with the other [Rules of Order & Procedure requirements](#)) in the school's [Rules of Order & Procedure](#) (also known as Bylaws) and should be reviewed by **SCCs** annually.
- UPCOMING FOR FEBRUARY: Look at data to identify school needs in preparation for goal-setting.
  - UPCOMING FOR MARCH: Set and enter school goals on the USBE LAND Trust Site by March 25<sup>th</sup>.
