"The Woodstock School Community Council supports Governor Spencer Cox effort to limit student access to smart devices, including cell phones, smart watches and tablets during the school day.

- The Woodstock SCC understands that smart devices are a useful tool for promoting safety and connection between school and home
- Smart devices brought to school are the sole responsibility of the individual student. Woodstock will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or broken devices, as these devices are not required by the school.
- If a student brings a smart device to school, the device may not be used for calls, texts, internet access, photos, videos, games, or video or sound recording without staff permission in advance
- Students may use these devices on campus once they are out of school and out of the building"

Inside Recess Policy

- Explains we need a clarifying policy on temperature high-low, etc.

- General Guideline: Mrs. Clayton will make the call for morning line up @ 29 degrees

 Mrs. Clayton will make the call for recess is with a low of 25 degrees except for air quality, moisture, and safety. Motion 1st Willy Ray 2nd Matt Fields, all in favor.

The Woodstock School Community Council (2023-2024) has established the following guidelines for inclement weather:

Before School

- The school principal is responsible for evaluating local conditions to determine if students can line up outside of school. The principal may call for an indoor line-up if the following safety conditions are an issue.
 - The temperature is below 29 degrees or windchill makes the temperature feel below 29 degrees
 - Rain, snow, wind, fog, or ice make it unsafe or uncomfortable for students to be outside.
 - Lack of sunlight
 - Issues related to construction or emergencies.

Morning, Lunch, and Afternoon Recess

- The school principal is responsible for evaluating local conditions to determine if students can go outside for recess. Morning and afternoon recess are 13 minutes. Lunch recess is approximately 20 minutes. The principal may call for an indoor line-up if the following safety conditions are an issue.
 - The temperature is below 25 degrees or windchill makes the temperature feel below 25 degrees
 - Rain, snow, wind, fog, or ice make it unsafe or uncomfortable for students to be outside.
 - o Issues related to construction or emergencies.
